Lindsay's work on the federal budget includes analysis of the federal budget process and politics, military spending, and specifically how federal budget choices for different spending priorities and taxation interact. A particular area of focus is how a decades-long policy of out-sized military budgets has eroded political will to invest in opportunity and human potential through greater federal support of education, health care, infrastructure and more.

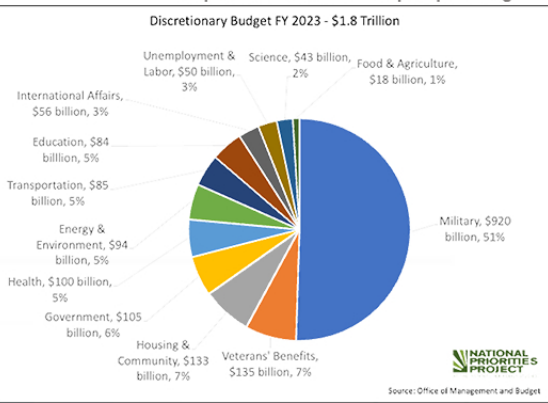
